directed the team but scored 34 points, almost all at long range.

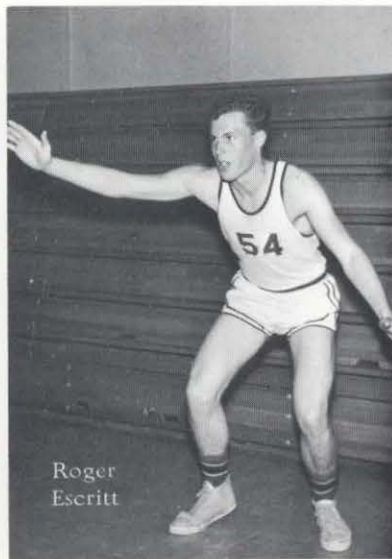

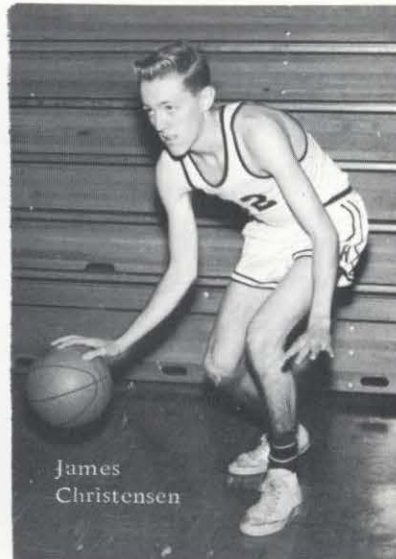
The school spirit created by the team and the coaches has had a distinct carry-over to the general school atmosphere. In other words Humphrey High School is moving again. Let's keep it moving.



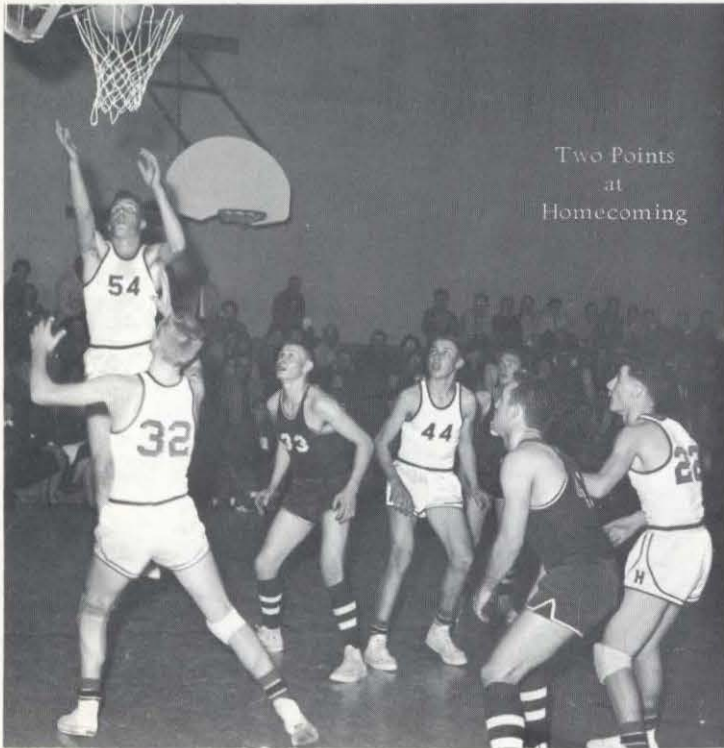

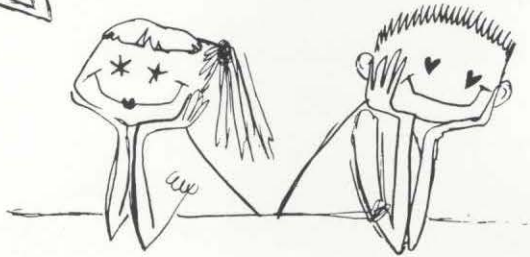

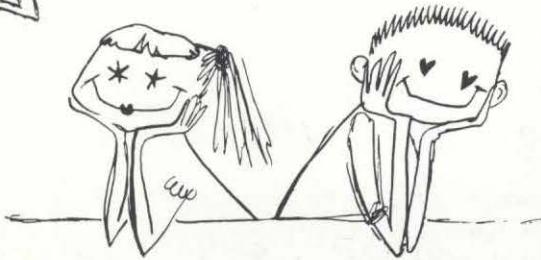
