

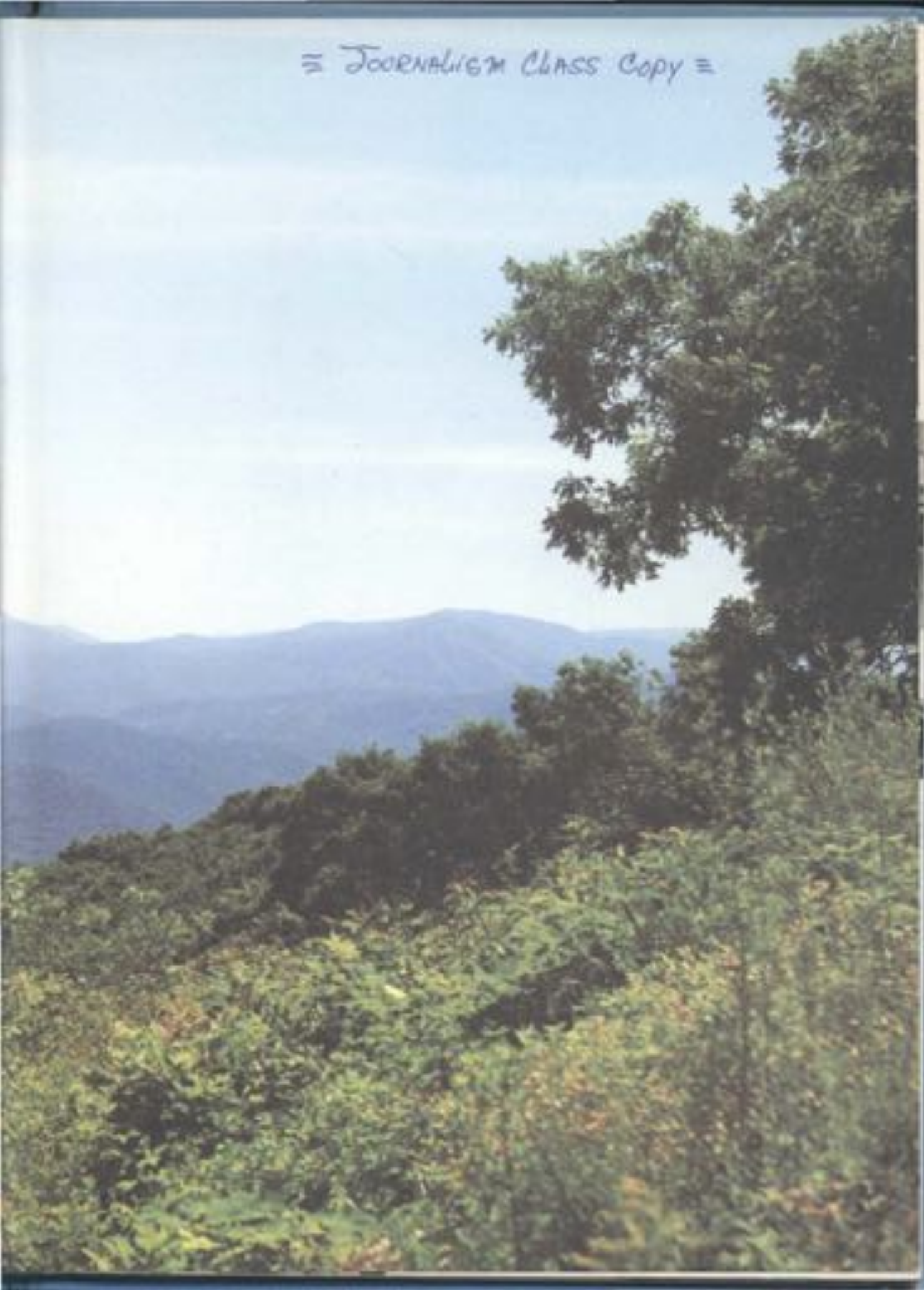

This page is dedicated to the annual staff of 1976-1977. On this page we will try to explain just what has been done for this year's annual.

The staff this year consisted of one sponsor, Mr. Ray Schuster, one yearbook advisor, Mr. Bill Jandrik one professional photography studio; The Jim Frieze Studio, fifteen hard working girls for the seventh period Journalism Class and three or four ambitious girls for the eighth period lab.

To start out the year, fifteen class members turned saleswomen and ventured from town to town, store to store, in search of local merchants in Norfolk, Columbus, and surrounding towns. As a result, our ad sales bettered last year's by about \$600, which gave us the grand total of \$2,400 worth of ads sold to us. This came as a surprise to almost everyone but it seemed to set the pace for the whole year. Once we had the ads all set up, we figured all that was left was taking the pictures and putting the pages together.

Then came the hard work and all the decisions. It seemed as if everytime we saw Mr. Jandrik, we had another decision to make about the cover, endsheets, copy type, letter design, or division pages. We soon learned there was alot to do for the annual. One of our most important decisions was designing our own division pages. To add a little fun to the pages, we decided to put a little artwork on each page. These division pages were drawn by some of our great class members, Cindy Fischer, and Sharie Orth. The little artwork by the page numbers was drawn by Pam Bender and Sherri Baumgart. The ads section was done by Sharie Orth with the help of a few other girls who had time during class.

The annual was divided in sections. One or two girls were assigned to each section. First, the soft sheets were drawn up, then we tried to decide what kind of pictures we wanted. Next, we drew up the hard layout sheets on which the pictures were pasted. Several class members took these pictures, and the film was sent to Mr. Frieze for processing. When we got the contact sheets back we sized the pictures we wanted, which then went back to Mr. Frieze for processing. When we got the sized pictures back, we glued them to the hard sheets. Copy or wording was then written to correspond with the pictures on that particular page. Body copy was written in the past tense along with all the captions under the pictures.

When a certain number of pages were completed or if a deadline had to be met the pages were sent to the company for printing we missed our first deadline by two days, but because we sent in 68 pages when we only needed 32 we didn't lose any production days, so to complete the annual we only needed 60 more pages. So by our third deadline, which we missed by a few days, we sent the remainder of the pages that were done except for Seniors, Graduation, and a few other pages. We finished the remaining pages after Graduation and sent them in before our last deadline on June 6, 1977.

So with the last deadline met, we knew we had finally finished the annual and another successful year in Journalism Class. The seniors wish to next year's Journalism Class their working ability, all their cute little sayings, and artwork so that next year's annual would be as great as we hoped this one would be. Good luck to the editors as you will always need it on the annual. Good luck to the entire staff of next years annual; we hope that it is as successful as this one was!

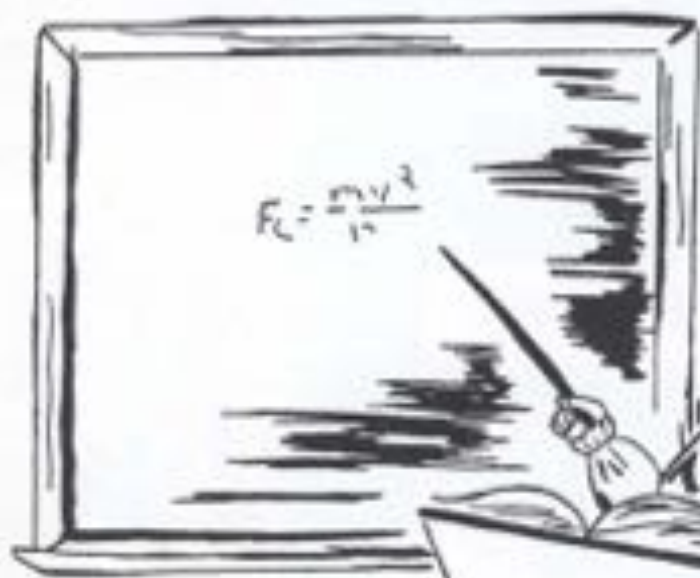

## grade school extras

"Speech" is one of our most important mode of communication. If one cannot speak, he finds it extremely difficult to relate in our world. That is why the Humphrey School system set up a Speech Therapy Department. In therapy, a person received help to learn how to make his or her communication intelligent, pleasant, and inconspicuous. They learned to make an unexceptable habit acceptable in our society.

This year the Title I Reading Program was established at a room in the convent. Inside this room students were taught by Mr. Lueninghoener, better known to them as Mr. L.

This program was set up for students who were below average in Reading. No report cards were handed out the first semester. The emphasis was on learning and improving reading rather than obtaining an A, B, or C. In other words, he believed in helping students help themselves.

The program was not tied to one specific text book. There were basal readers, workbooks, recordings, flash cards, word games etc. The emphasis was on exposing pupils to many types of reading.

The Learning Disabilities Program has become a class of its own for the first time this year. Nine students are enrolled attending thirty-minute classes two days a week. The children are taught on a one-to-one basis providing special help for those with problems in subject areas. Math and Reading are the two subjects most heavily stressed with various skills being reinforced. Emphasis is also placed on activities to stress gross and fine motor coordination, eye-hand coordination, and visual memory exercise.

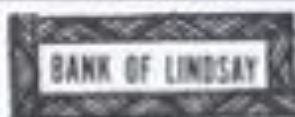

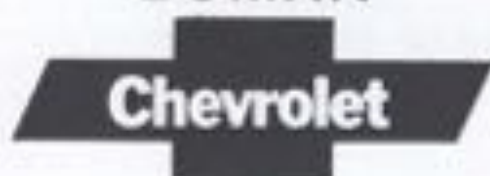
