The Nebraska Rural Community Schools Spring Conference was held on Thursday, March 14 in Kearney, NE. The Humphrey FFA Chapter was selected to present on their projects with Crop Production and Floral Sales. Mrs. Graham and two students provided great information within their presentation and proudly represented Humphrey Public Schools and the FFA Chapter. It is always a great opportunity to highlight the great things we have going on within our school at a state conference for school administrators.

Humphrey Public Schools completed our 5-year school improvement external visit that is required as part of Rule 10 accreditation requirements. The visit was completed on March 18 \& 19 . There were five team members present in our district to conduct the visit. Team members consisted of a superintendent, two principals, an ESU professional development coordinator, and a school district instructional coach. The team reviewed achievement data, district processes for academics and interventions, and interviewed a variety of students and stakeholders. The visit was a very positive experience and the team was very complimentary of Humphrey Public Schools and the great things we have established within our school system. They provided great feedback for our staff and administration to consider as we start the process of selecting goals for the next 5-year cycle.

As I end my letter, I will continue to do my very best to model the importance of respect for self and others, promote Bulldog pride in our school, provide a safe and productive environment and provide educational opportunities for our students and staff. I would suggest a Google Doc or Education Quest's Activities Resume. If you are interested in the Activities Resume option, please create an account at www.educationquest.com. After you have created the account, you will find a box titled "Activities Resume." You may then enter any school activities, community activities, and awards that you may have been involved in or received. As long as you always remember your password, or save it somewhere, you will have access to this resume.
3. I challenge all of you to be leaders for underclassmen. This means to set good examples by being involved, helping others, and working hard. The school atmosphere depends largely upon all of you. It is what you make it, so make it great!
$11^{\text {th }}$ Grade:
4. It has reached April. You just recently took the ACT. I know you all tried your best, and I am so hopeful your scores make you happy. Please, know you are not defined by this score, though. It's just one test.
5. In case you are interested in taking the ACT again over the summer, you will all still have access to your On To College accounts where you can take a refresher course on John Baylor's grammar tips right before testing.
6. How important is the ACT? It can mean the difference in attending college for free or needing to go into debt to afford college. It can mean the difference in being accepted to certain colleges or not. It can mean having to take remedial courses in college or being able to take the courses right away that are needed for your degree. Many colleges have started to accept super scores, which is the average of all the highest scores in each sub test. Therefore, if you don't have the score you want after one test, please don't give up. Try again!
7. As always, please continue to research future careers and colleges. Campus visits are huge in helping to determine a good fit for you. Please, let me know if you would like me to set up a visit or if you would like to do so on your own. Job Shadows are good opportunities to look at future careers as well. If you need help with this, please let me know.

12 $^{\text {th }}$ Grade:

1. You are almost finished, but not yet. Please, continue to work hard, show up to class, and maintain good grades. Colleges can still deny you if there are many slips in your academic performance.
2. Many of you have been involved over the years, and I believe it will pay off.
